Dade City Takes District Title

Little Leaguers Beat Zephyrhills Twice

Dawson Phillips stood at third with the game against rival Zephyrhills tied at 11.

If he scores, Dade City takes the District 25 Little League 8-10-year-old championship. If he gets stranded, the game goes to extra innings.

He did not have the green light to go home on a wild pitch or a passed ball, but he did anyway and Dade City took the title.

"He went on his own," said a smiling Dade City manager Eric Creech. "There was no stopping the kid. You see how fast he is."

The game saw Dade City jump out to a 7-0 lead only to allow Zephyrhills to battle back to take the lead 11-9 heading into the bottom of the sixth before Phillips' ensuing heroics.

"It was incredible, nerve-wracking, exciting, but it was a good game," Creech said. "I am proud to be these kids' coach. When we came into the dugout in the bottom of the sixth, no one was down. We were still upbeat. They just stuck with it and kept picking away.

"Fortunately, we came away with the win."

Making clutch contact in the sixth inning were Emilio Jouregui and Brady Stevens. Both scored to tie the game setting up Phillips' dash to the dish.

Dade City defeated Zephyrhills 19-6 on Sunday in the winner's bracket semifinals.

In that game, Zephyrhills kept it

close with Dade City until the top of the fourth, when Dade City turned the game into a track meet to eventually take the game via the 10-run mercy

Mets May Have Another Gem Dave Eiland Could Soon Be Coaching Fireballer

The sport of baseball is unique as there are different elements of talent that go into the game that aren't used in many other aspects of life, such as throwing a fastball at a high velocity. If you are able to do so on a consistent basis with control, you may have a future in the sport as a pitcher.

Meet Franklin Parra, an 18-year-old from Santo Domingo, Dominican Republic. He wasn't known too well when he moved to Long Island, N.Y. However, a stellar senior high school season with impressive stuff made scouts attend a struggling baseball program in Copiague to see Parra's electric pitching.

"I wasn't really expected to be drafted because I didn't do that good during my school season," Parra said.

He went 2-3 with 74 strikeouts in 34 innings pitched in his senior season of high school. With a four-pitch repertoire that includes a two seam fastball, slider, changeup and curveball, along with his 6'1 stature and the ability to throw up to 93 mph, major league scouts were attending games of his 4-16 team.

Admittedly, Parra wasn't good at first, but he put in the effort to hone his craft and improve on his location. Instead of hanging out with friends and sleeping in during the summer as most teenagers do, Parra will immediately head to Port St. Lucie to the Mets complex to begin his road to the major leagues.

You might be wondering where the connection to east Pasco is, but the pitching coach of the New York Mets is none other than Zephyrhills' native son Dave Eiland. Eiland had an unremarkable MLB career as a player, but has sparkled as a pitching coach and guides an outstanding Mets pitching staff that Parra hopes to join in the near

Organization Targets Pasco Voters With Misleading Mailing

Brian E. Corley, Supervisor of Elections, warns voters of a potentially misleading mailing from the Center for Voter Information (CVI), a Washington D.C. based organization. The organization has in the past used outdated and often incorrect data to mail pre-filled Florida Voter Registration Applications to voters who are already registered, deceased family members,

under-age children and pets.

"We've been put on notice that over 4,800 Pasco voters will be receiving information from the CVI," said Supervisor Corley. "In today's climate of security risks and identity theft, it creates suspicion and mistrust from voters who are already registered to vote, and wonder if something has happened to their voter registration record."

The Center for Voter Information is affiliated with the Voter Participation Center, and both organizations have launched similar campaigns in Pasco in the past. The mailings notoriously prompt phone calls from confused voters who mistakenly believe the mailing is coming from the Supervisor of Elections' Office. "Make no mistake," said Supervisor

Corley. "These organizations are in no way associated with the State of Florida, the Florida Division of Elections or my office."

Voters should direct their questions, complaints and concerns about the mailing directly to the CVI at (202) 766-6575.

SLU Athletics Places Fourth in Learfield Directors' Cup

Saint Leo University Athletics recently placed fourth in the 2017-2018 Learfield Directors' Cup Division II, a program that honors institutions for achieving success in sports. This marks the third time in four years that Saint Leo placed in the Learfield Directors' Cup top 10. Saint Leo also placed as the top Sunshine State Conference (SSC) institution.

On June 14, the National Association of

Collegiate Directors of Athletics (NACDA) released the final standings, showing Saint Leo earned a total of 695.25 points. This marked the 17th Directors' Cup standings (Sears, NACDA, United States Sports Academy, or Learfield) Saint Leo has ranked in, while it is the second highest finish in school history.

Saint Leo also finished as the top SSC institution and has claimed a top five finish for two of the last three years. A total of eight Sunshine State Conference institutions were ranked among the top 100 in the latest Directors' Cup standings report.

"We have an incredible staff and student-athletes who strive for excellence," said Fran Reidy, Saint Leo's vice president of Athletics. "Our five-year run of great finishes is a remarkable feat when you

consider where Saint Leo was just a short time ago. We are proud of our two top five finishes over the last three years as we strive to be one of the best all-around programs in Division II."

The Learfield Directors' Cup was developed as a joint effort between NACDA and USA Today. Points are awarded based on each institution's finish in NCAA championships.




